SYC SPONSORS FIRST ANNUAL N.O. - YUCATAN RACE Saludos a Nuestros Amigos del Club de Yates de Isla Mujeres!

"REGATA AL SOL" (Regatta to the Sun) is the name given to the 550 mile ocean race from New Orleans to Isla Mujeres, Q. R., Mexico, which will take place for the first time on June 16 of this year, and will be an annual event.

At the suggestion of the Mexican National Tourist Council, the Southern Yacht Club and the Club de Yates of Isla Mujeres have joined in sponsoring the race. Southern was chosen because of its long sailing tradition and fame, which are well recognized by our friends south of

the border. As Southern Yacht Club is second oldest in the United States, Club de Yates holds the same position in Mexico.


The race will begin on June 16 off the new lightship at the entrance to the New Orleans Ship Channel in Breton Sound, and will finish off the Isla Mujeres Light. The trophy for the event will be awarded by the President of Mexico, Gustavo Diaz Ordaz, and will be known as the President of Mexico Prize.

Isla Mujeres is an island off the coast of Yucatan Peninsula, known

for its exceptionally clear water and fabulous skin diving. There is a new modern hotel on the Island where participants in the race will be housed for the festivities following the race.

The Mexican Government has planned a fiesta around the ancient Maya Festival of the Sun, which will include celebrations at Isla Mujeres, Vallodolid, Merida, visits to the Mayan Ruins of Uxmal, Chichen-Itza, and Kabah, as well as to the walled city of Campeche.
